HOW TO SAFELY DISPOSE OF WASTE

| GENERAL INFORMATION | ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED | PICKUP DAYS |

| <p>RECYCLING</p> <p>All materials must be placed curbside by 7:00 AM on the collection date. Do not place items in plastic bags.</p> <p>COMMINGLED ITEMS:</p> <p>GLASS: only food and beverage containers made of unbroken clear, brown or green glass. METAL CONTAINERS: food and beverage containers, clean aluminum foil and trays, and empty aerosol cans.</p> <p>PLASTICS: PET and HDPE plastic containers (code 1 thru 7 printed on container) commonly used for food, beverages, detergents or shampoos.</p> <p>All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed then combined in one bin or more. Metal and plastic lids and caps can be placed with your comingled items. Labels need not be removed.</p> <p>PAPER ITEMS:</p> <p>NEWSPAPERS, OUTDATED PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGS, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS & ENVELOPES: Place at curbside in the "Blue Box", brown paper bags, or corrugated cardboard boxes. Do not bundle them with cord, twine or rope, or put them in plastic bags. CORRUGATED CARDBOARD & BROWN PAPER BAGS: Remove excessive amounts of adhesive tape, tie in bundles or break down and box. Do not place in plastic bags. Keep items dry.</p> | <p>Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.</p> <p>Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & windows, paint cans, pesticide containers, oil cans, five gallon pails, foam plastic, plastic bags and flower pots.</p> <p>Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals.</p> <p>Hardcover books, orange juice containers.</p> <p>No styrofoam or plastic packing materials.</p> | <p>EVERY WEDNESDAY EXCLUDING HOLIDAY</p> |
| <p>HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE</p> <p>Regular household garbage will be collected twice weekly on designated days. Please note that on holidays, garbage collection will be cancelled for that day which will result in only one pickup that week. See Schedule on reverse.</p> | <p>Recyclables, household hazardous wastes, large items qualifying for bulky pickup</p> | <p>MONDAY/THURSDAY OR TUESDAY/FRIDAY</p> |
| <p>BULKY WASTE FEE: \$20.00</p> <p>Residents may arrange for bulky waste collection on scheduled days by contacting DPW at 337-7338. Please note that payment must be received before the scheduled pickup date. Items for collection must be placed at curbside the night before or by 7:00 am the morning of the scheduled pickup.</p> <p>Items of Collection: Old furniture, old carpeting and padding, old books, dried open paint cans. Basically anything too heavy for regular garbage that does not qualify as a household hazardous waste.</p> | <p>Car batteries, car tires, building materials, debris from construction work, bath tubs, water heaters, heating boilers, iron, steel, stones propane tanks.</p> | <p>EACH WEEK EXCLUDING HOLIDAYS. PICKUP DAY DEPENDS ON YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE COLLECTION</p> |
| <p>Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners (properly stickered with freon and doors removed). Computer monitors and television monitors, washers, dryers, electronic equipment.</p> | | <p>2ND THURSDAY OR FRIDAY OF THE MONTH</p> |
| <p>BATTERIES: Spent household batteries such as those found in flashlights, radios and toys may be placed in your regular garbage. Please call Public Works for all other batteries.</p> | <p>Car batteries: return to place of purchase</p> | |
| <p>HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE</p> <p>Hazardous household chemicals should never be thrown away with your regular garbage or poured into drain. Qualifying items are: bleaches, varnishes, stains, swimming pool chemicals, fire starting liquids or kerosene, pesticides, car batteries, used car tires (maximum 10), waxes and polishes, photographic chemicals, wood preservatives, septic tank cleaners, TV's and computer monitors. The construction of a permanent HMRF is being completed in Valhalla, N.Y. Once opened, residents will have the opportunity to drop of all items that fall under this category. It is expected to open in the first quarter of 2012 For further information please visit www.westchestergov.com</p> | <p>Latex paint (dry cans qualify for bulky waste pickup), solvents, and pesticides, compressed gas cylinders/propane tanks, explosives, smoke or fire detectors, products from commercial and institutional users.</p> | <p>Contact the HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEANUP HOTLINE CALL 813-5425 for location and questions.</p> |
| <p>YARD WASTE all material as outlined below shall be placed in BIODEGRADABLE BAGS</p> <p>The use of these bags has increased the efficiency of the program as well as created a cleaner landscape.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Please do not put concrete, soil or other non-organic material in the bag and do not overfill them. Branches should be cut into 4 foot lengths and tied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter. Keep all yard waste behind the curb and not in the street. We encourage our residents to leave their grass clippings on their lawn as a means of recycling. Grass clippings can also be placed with your yard waste in biodegradable bags. | <p>Tree trunks, stumps, large limbs over 4" in diameter, dirt, sod, and stones</p> | <p>MARCH 1 through OCTOBER 22</p> <p>GARDENERS MUST POSSESS A VALID LANDSCAPER PERMIT ISSUED BY THE VILLAGE OF BRONXVILLE</p> |
| <p>AUTUMN LEAVES</p> <p>DO NOT MIX TWIGS, BRANCHES, RUBBISH, FLOWERS OR ANY OTHER MATERIALS IN THE LEAF PILES AS IT DELAYS COLLECTION. Place behind the curb and keep off the streets and sidewalks. DO NOT BLOCK FIRE HYDRANTS OR STORM DRAINS. Better yet...why don't you mulch your leaves in place. Please visit www.villageofbronxville.com and click on the Green Committee page for further information.</p> | <p>Contaminated piles, tree trunks, stumps, large limbs over 4" in diameter</p> | <p>OCTOBER 22 through DECEMBER 16</p> |
| <p>RADIOLOGICAL MEDICATION RESIDUALS</p> <p>If you or your pets are receiving medical treatment involving radioactive materials, all residuals or personal items that would collect body fluids should be returned to the hospital or health care facility where you or your pet received the treatment for proper disposal.</p> | | <p>Any Questions? | <p>STORM DRAINS</p> <p>Please refrain from depositing materials, plastic bags, etc. into the storm drains and catch basins. These materials will either wind up in the streams that feed the Hudson River or Long Island Sound and/or clog the drainage system causing flooding of local streets.
